

On Thursday the 14th of July, we were lucky enough to host the first ever cluster Maths-a-thon, with over 100 pupils from local primary schools attending.

Ormiston Herman Academy, Peterhouse Academy, Southtown Primary, Cliff Park Junior School and Edward Worlledge Primary competed against each other in year groups 3-6 for the chance of winning trophies for their schools. The Year 7 students from OVA also competed with the girls team taking away the trophy.

The excited young students got to take advantage of our new hand held tablets as they answered quick mental maths questions on the website known as Kahoot. Each team had 5 seconds to discuss the question with in their teams before choosing the correct answer from a series of multiple choice coloured options.

From the start, Herman's second team quickly took the lead, finishing in an overall 1st place for year 3, 4 and 6, followed closely by Peterhouse's second team who managed to take home the year 5 trophy.

Some of our year 10 students have visited the health club, worked out in the gym and have spoken with Mr McCormack about numerous business ventures.

The main opportunity is for 8 of our students to begin a 12 month scholarship programme at the health club, bolstering their CV, work experience, business skills and entrepreneurial possibilities.

They will receive 6 sessions of business related training free of charge, led by experts in the industry in a variety of settings including the academy and Potters Leisure Resort. They will be working at the health club and meeting customers and clients, as well as enjoying free membership.

These students will have external mentors who will be there to advise and help them through their senior year at the academy and assist them with their future career choices. This pilot scheme was very successful last year and will be developed further with new opportunities this time round.

Students had to write an initial letter of application, meet with Mr McComack and impress in an interview. Initially 22 students showed an interest and 18 progressed to the interview stage.

All of the candidates conducted themselves admirably throughout the whole process and were a credit to the academy.

The students begin their training with an induction at the health club and are keen to begin their work. The students have begun a legacy for future students to follow in their footsteps as we provide opportunities for students to 'Venture into Business'.

We wish them all the best in the future and will support and monitor their progress with enthusiasm.




On Monday 27th and Tuesday 28th June Venture welcomed the class of 2021 from their primary schools for two transition days.

### **Curriculum Enrichment Week** At Venture A Big Hit

With our Senior Year departing us for pastures new and year 10 on work experience, it gives us the opportunity to do something different with the remaining students in the school.

On the week beginning the 27th June the entire curriculum was collapsed. This gave whole year groups an opportunity



to work on one off projects and skill days within faculties but also the opportunity to try out some different topics and lessons and have external visitors come in.

Inspired Youth, an enterprise group came in to work with each year group in the hall. Over the course of the day, the whole year group, split into smaller groups would come up with a new idea for a cookie or other marketable item.

Students needed to design and advertise their new product In the afternoon break out groups voted for their top ideas and the best came back to the hall to present to the rest of the year group to determine the top idea. Mission-CPD. Over the course of the three days the 428 students took part in a one hour session where students learned CPR and how to use a defibrillator.

Currently only 1 in 10 people survive an outof-hospital cardiac arrest but this training aims to change that. The CPR training which Ormiston Venture Academy participated in could mean the

difference between life and death for any of the 30,000 people who have a cardiac arrest every year.

We also welcomed visiting sessions from Norwich City Community Foundation on the Monday and had some really eye opening 'Reality Check' sessions from St Martins



The Create College is made up of a team of highly dedicated and enthusiastic staff and students. The Create subjects include Art, Photography and Textiles, where best practice and expertise are shared on a daily basis.



The Create College is the one of the most enjoyable places to be. It runs a broad and balanced curriculum for students in Key Stage 3, with an option of further development in year 8, studying favourite subjects in more depth.

Key Stage 4 offers GCSE and BTEC qualifications and is hugely popular. Last year over 70% of year 11 students completed at least 1 Create qualification, and 35% completed 2 with some exceptionally high results.

Students go on to study these subjects in more depth in Colleges and Sixth Forms.

Apprenticeships in engineering and scholarships at Gresham's are also available. For example former Venture student and Gresham's scholarship winner Callum Cooke has gone on to study fine arts at Oxford University.

The extra-curricular opportunities within the Create College dominate the Academy's provision. Clubs and activities such as choir, orchestra (Venture Vivace),

carpentry skills and street dance amongst others, complement sessions based on improving qualification grades.

Peri lessons enhance musical talent, and we

are very grateful for the team of staff who come into the Academy for this.



# Venturing into Work Experience

On 27th June, over one hundred Year 10 students from Ormiston Venture Academy embarked on a week of work experience. Excited and apprehensive at the same time, the students readied themselves for five days in the workplace throughout the area.

Following interviews through Ormiston Venture's careers department, students had a sense of purpose and engaged local employers across a variety of industries to line up some fantastic opportunities.

This year, more students than ever before undertook inspiring experiences in the fields of medicine and engineering with two students even winning the chance to work for a local radio station as presenters.

Nursery school and primary school placements were also popular destinations. Shrublands Preschool, which has been an ardent supporter of Ormiston Venture's work experience week, this year said that Jasmine has been, "one of their best ever" placements to date.

Harbour Radio also gave
Venture great feedback saying,
"Can we keep your students?
They have been magnificent."

At Great Yarmouth College, students Haydn Priestly and Zak Buttifant, undertook work experience in the Engineering and ICT departments, and were also described as the best students they have ever had.

Over the last two years Potters Resort has established an even closer relationship with Venture.
