£250,000 Awarded to innovative education project led by

## ignite

The Alliance, based at Ormiston Venture Academy, will lead this groundbreaking work by developing a new English curriculum based on research and best practice gathered from across the UK and internationally.

The project will focus on raising the attainment of 11- to 14-year-old boys (Key Stage 3) from disadvantaged backgrounds. English teachers from secondary schools across Norfolk and Suffolk will be given access to curriculum materials for lessons, be supported through training, and have access to extensive support. The project is underpinned by a synthesis of collaborative learning, metacognition and feedback strategies that are deployed to ensure effective teaching of reading and writing skills.

Ignite Teaching School Alliance has been awarded £250,000 from the Department for Education's Strategic School Improvement Fund to develop and implement an innovative English curriculum across secondary schools in Norfolk and Suffolk.

A whole school approach to literacy will be paired with this to ensure literacy skills are transferred across the curriculum for every pupil to benefit. The National Literacy Trust will provide expertise and support to schools to embed literacy across the range of subjects throughout the curriculum.

Jodie Gilbert-Barnham, Ignite TSA, Dean of Programmes, said:

"The project is an excellent opportunity for schools to collaborate on developing the reading and writing skills of disadvantaged boys. This is crucial as having strong literacy skills provides the bedrock for students as they progress through their education and beyond. In a nutshell, literacy empowers."

Catherine Boulton, National Literacy Trust, said:

"We are delighted to be supporting Jodie and her team by providing professional development and insights for teachers in all nine schools. The project addresses an important challenge and we are looking forward to building on the work schools have already done."

45 high achieving year 9 students from Ormiston Venture **Academy visited the Science** Museum in London for a day packed full of exciting interactive experiments, presentations, demonstrations and exhibitions.

The trip was organised by Andrew Underwood, a Higher Education Champion from the Network for East Anglian Collaborative Outreach (NEACO) working on the Take Your Place project, and was a huge success.

Students were able to see the exhibitions in the museum before being treated to a 3D experience of the 'Beautiful Planet' in the IMAX theatre, filmed from the International Space Station.

The students were then able to get hands on with interactive experiments and demonstrations in the Wonderlab. Students learnt about Physics, Chemistry and Maths concepts inside the Wonderlab and saw amazing electricity and chemistry demonstrations before their very eyes.

The Wonderlab had over 50 "mind-blowing exhibits, shows and demonstrations".

This included a live experiment demonstrating the extraordinary properties of bubbles, seeing a lightning strike right before your eyes and of course playing with forces on giant slides.

Both areas provide lots of opportunities to students both in the curriculum and outside of it to develop their passion for the subject.

There are so many sports activities and clubs to get involved with at Venture,

including but not limited to trampolining, badminton, speed and strength conditioning, football, netball, rounders, softball and athletics. Athletics is one of our greatest strengths currently, 2018 saw Venture become crowned the district champions at Wellesley, we have also picked up trophies this year in netball, football and rounders across the year groups.

We have our Venture Elite programme which focusses opportunities on those committed and talented team players, linking to clubs and coaches outside of the academy, promoting access to leadership award and culminating in an annual Elite Sports Awards ceremony which is a great evening. We are hoping to run several trips next year including University Trips, a trip to International sporting fixtures including the Netball World Cup, and we hope to see the return of the PE camp for KS4 students. Science is always one of the best lessons in the academy and has a brilliant mix of theoretical and practical study. Students

now have to complete
21 Required Practical
Assessments in Science as
part of their GCSE.

These will be done throughout years 9 – 11 as formal practical tasks

and assessed as part of the final written exams. Students can develop both their practical science and team working skills. We try to engage in as much extra curricular work as possible and I am sure there will be some interesting science guilds next year.

In terms of trips year 9 students will have an opportunity to attend 'Bringing Scientists to You' event at East Norfolk 6th Form College. This is run by the different science faculties at UEA and is a hands-on experience day full of inspiring science activities. Students have really valued this experience for the last 2 years. And of course there is the annual Year 7 rocket- building competition as part of the College Clash.



#### **English**

The annual overnight trip to London included a bird's eye view of the city from the London Eye, a scary visit to The London Dungeon, dinner at the famous Hardrock Café, a theatre visit to see the smash hit stage show Matilda and, finally, a tour of the Olympic park, culminating in a petrifying ride on the famous Arcellormittal Orbit Slide. Needless to say, everyone slept well after this trip!

Students used their excellent spelling skills to compete against teams from other Norfolk schools in the annual Spelling Bee.

In lessons, students have had a wide range of learning experiences, including the opportunity to re-enact the play An Inspector Calls and a much bigger focus on the development of debating skills.
