Come for a chat and a chill on Wednesday lunchtimes!

#WeWill is a fantastic project brought to Ormiston Venture Academy by our friends at Ormiston Families. Wellbeing Ambassadors have been trained by #WeWill and actively lead the project by making decisions about how best to support fellow Venture students.

Mr Cooper supports the work between Ormiston Families and Ormiston Venture and believes

"The #WeWill Wellbeing Ambassadors are an invaluable support; not only giving themselves the skills and confidence to talk to others and support their peers but also helping our Venture community in giving these students a place to go where they can speak to Our Wellbeing Ambassadors and discuss any issues they may be having. This allows our Wellbeing Ambassadors to help the students get support within the academy from key staff or signpost them to any support agencies necessary. Naomi Swain has been such an amazing support in implementing the #WeWill project within the academy and we hope to continue this amazing partnership with Ormiston Families for years to come to ensure we can support not just our students here at Venture but our wider community."

#WeWill Wellbeing Ambassadors meet every Wednesday lunchtime and offer pupils various activities to opt to take part in. Recent examples of this are arts and crafts, as well as outdoor Connect4 and Jenga. Pupils can choose to take part or use the space as a quiet place to spend their lunchbreak. Wellbeing Ambassadors are on hand to chat to fellow pupils about their day, anything that might be on their mind, such as difficulties they may be experiencing with friendships. #WeWill is able to support anyone who needs further help by signposting them to staff or services, or sometimes to just be a listening ear when someone needs a chat.

Naomi Swain, Senior Youth Support Worker on the #WeWill project, stated

"The Venture Wellbeing Ambassadors are a fantastic group of young people who represent their school with enthusiasm and endeavour. Whilst we have provided them with training for their role, they already all have great attitudes of kindness and empathy and go out of their way to make the lives of students better. I wish Wellbeing Ambassadors existed when I was at school pupils have peers to talk to about their wellbeing and who take the time to support each other". The #WeWill Wellbeing Ambassadors recently ran their own guild – identifying areas of mental health which they felt important in their school and inviting speakers in for sessions. Norfolk and Waveney Mind discussed anxiety and low mood, Embrace tackled resilience and motivation to change negative situations, Norfolk LGBT talked about gender identity and sexuality and NSFT addressed eating disorders for Ambassadors and others who had chosen the Mental Health guild.

#WeWill Wellbeing Ambassadors have further supported new Venture pupils by taking part in July's transition days; being on hand to answer any questions that the then Year 6s had and talking to them about their school.


They also assisted in supporting pupils at the August Summer School, taking part in various activities as well as joining new pupils on the Pleasurewood Hills trip.

Venture Food Champions' main aim is to educate students on the importance of a healthy and balanced lifestyle, whilst also exposing them to a range of rich and diverse cultures through food.

Over the course of the last six months alone, the Food Champions have planned and run the Academy's first cultural day focused around 'Eid' where students

could engage with information about the Arabic Festival and also taste foods from around the countries that celebrate 'Eid'.

To celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, the Food Champions decorated the Venture Café and offered classic British dishes with the help of the canteen staff, celebrating the British Values that we as an Academy hold dear.

With veganism and vegetarianism growing in the 21st Century, it was important to the Food Champions that students are educated on the reasons that people seek meat-free alternatives and therefore held a 'Meat-Free' Day in the Academy.

Through the use of educational videos and PL-class discussions, students were made aware that there is more than one reason why people do not eat meat: for personal health; avoiding illness perhaps due to intolerance; for animal welfare beliefs; for environmental protection reasons and for religious beliefs where a person's religion does not permit them to eat certain meats.

Additionally, the students have worked hard to research and promote alternative options on food for dietary, health and religious reasons. The Food Champions have also run multiple

taste tasting sessions for students to get involved with in order for them to try sugar free and/ or fat free alternatives as a part of a healthy lifestyle.

> The Food Champions meet weekly to discuss and plan whole academy events that will allow all students to explore and learn about new foods too.

In order to gain a direct voice from the Venture cohort, Food Champions have run multiple audits, including using 'Question of the Week', to gain information on how to improve 'food culture' within the academy. Moreover, the Food Champions have also run numerous Collectives to advertise these events to ensure students know why these events are running and the importance of the Champions' aim

Led by Mr Doggett and assisted by Mr Ives, the college consists of three major subject areas; these are English, Humanities (History & Geography) and Modern Foreign Languages.

Achieve students will therefore always be a member of one of these faculties.

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During their time at Venture, students study a broad curriculum that prepares students to be experts in all areas of study. Our vision at Venture is to provide World Class education to all and provide

opportunities for our students to be subject specialists in all their subjects. Therefore in English, students have the opportunity to study Shakespeare, analyse poetry, write creatively and all students are also exposed to both modern and pre 1900s texts.

Trips to the Houses of Parliament for debating competitions and the Globe Theatre

are popular annual events. The English team also always lead the way with our annual World Book Day celebrations and run key events such as the 'poetry slam' when all colleges compete against each other and the annual spellathon, run by students for local primary school students.

In History, students are taught about the development of Britain following the Battle of Hastings through to the reign of Queen Victoria, while international topics are explored such as apartheid in South Africa and the conflict in Vietnam. In Geography, students learn about the eco-system and the impact climate change has on rivers and flooding as well as other hazards and the causes and consequences of population growth all over the planet. Local fieldwork on our coast, as well to Poland and the First World War trenches are a well received.

Aspire

The Create College is made up of a team of highly dedicated team and students which is led by Mr McInally, Assistant Principal and Mrs Vincent, College Leader.

Subjects include Art, Catering, Music, Performing Arts, Photography and Textiles. Best practice and expertise is shared on a daily basis, within the faculty, but also outside of the Academy through Ormiston Academy Trust links.

The Create College is the one of the most enjoyable places to be for staff and students. It operates a broad and balanced curriculum for students in Key Stage 3, with an option of further development in year 9, studying favourite subjects in more depth.

Key Stage 4 offers GCSE and BTEC qualifications and is hugely popular. An incredible amount of students go on to study at least 1 Create subject from year 10, and many leave with aspirations of further study in this area after achieving some exceptionally high results.



Students go on to study these subjects in more depth in Colleges and Sixth Forms. Apprenticeships in engineering and scholarships at Greshams are also available. We have had success with Callum Cooke then going on to study Fine Art at Oxford University for example.

The extra-curricular opportunities within the Create College dominate the academies provision. Clubs and activities such as Musical rehearsals, orchestra (Venture Vivace), photography skills and street dance amongst others, compliment sessions based on improving qualification grades.

Peri lessons enhance musical talent, and we are very grateful for the team of staff who come into the Academy for this. A showcase of Outstanding

Showcase events such as the bi-annual musical sell out audiences and the Create show is a representation of the fine work produced by students in Create. The show includes incredible Art and Photography exhibitions, phenomenal Craft and Textiles products, spine tingling musical entertainment, singing and performances as well as a breathtaking fashion show demonstrating the high quality pieces of clothing made in Textiles.

The faculty ran a musical last year – Beauty and the Beast, which sold out for 3 consecutive nights, making it the most popular show we have ever had!

The College is prominent in the local community attending carol services, lantern parades and performing at the Hippodrome concert. The Performing Arts students also performed in the recent Ormiston Academies Trust annual talent showcase.

Guest artists, graphical designers, animators, photographers, chefs, singers and dancers have graced our College and many trips to exhibitions and the West End theatre companies have occurred, broadening horizons and showing students the fruits of what can be achieved in this area.

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Innovate

Students in Science have had a fantastic relaunch of their practical experiments as Covid restrictions have eased.

Practical skills are so important and it creates the love of learning and awe and wonder that is amazing in science.Year 7 were investigatinghow shape effects streamlining using wallpaper paste and plasticine models and year 8 have been investigating acids and alkalis.

In other news - the Science Faculty has invested in a 3D printer and are now redesigning and 3D-printing equipment that allows students to work more safely and more efficiently in lessons.

The picture shows a redesigned test tube rack that is more stable and allows observations to be made more easily, a bespoke standfor electrolysis equipment that



reduces the risk of it tipping over in the middle of an investigation, a beaker lid that holds a thermometer upright in the centre of the beaker and a mini quadrat so that ecological sampling can take place whatever the weather.

Many other improvements to commercially available equipment are in the design phase and a College Clash competition to design improved science equipment is planned for next academic year.

The Innovate College is led by Mr Waters, Assistant Principal and Miss Teasdale, College Leader. At Venture we deliver a traditional PE curriculum for all five year groups with all key stage four students completing a Sport Studies qualification, as well as a diverse after school enrichment offer. After a very tough few years we are extremely excited that Venture Elite clubs and fixtures are back.

Students have been participating in our summer sports such as Athletics, Softball, Cricket, Tennis and Rounders across all year groups. We recently came third in the Wellesley Athletics tournament that all six local schools were involved in. Students also won lots of medals at the OAT sports cup for Athletics.

Venture Games is back with a bang with the whole academy enjoying sport in the sunshine. All students at the academy picked three sports to take part in and play throughout the day.

It was great to see all staff and students getting involved in a variety of sports.





A mixture of Year 8, 9 and 10 students rose to the challenges of Physical Theatre and developed their skills in teamwork and lifts to work with Richard from Frantic Assembly.

This was an experience that assisted the students in understanding how the body is used to communicate narrative within a performance.

Finn In Year 9 stated

"I really enjoyed learning new lifts to support with transitions in scenes."

The students challenged themselves and pushed out of their comfort



zones, I am a firm believer in, if I am making the students push themselves out of comfort zones then I have to demonstrate this myself!

So, to support students that were incredibly nervous to be lifted, I allowed a team of them to lift me...

It was a success and definitely not as scary as I thought it would be!

Fraia was successfully appointed as Venture's Head Girl in January 2022, after she blew away the interview panel with the maturity in her responses and the skills she would bring to representing the student body.

In her short time already as head girl she has bought about change, leading the first whole school UVS Barraza. Following on from this the students now have 120 extra outdoor seats and tables, the student PL captain role has doubled in numbers, the UVS raised over £2000 for the Ukraine humanitarian appeal and many college clash events such as the Colour Run and Doughnut eating contest.

Due to the success of Fraia's application she was put forward to apply for a role on the OAT East student parliament. Again Fraia completed a speech on why student voice was important to her and how she would have an impact on making social change. Fraia was successful in achieving the role of Secretary for the OAT East student parliament. This week forms part of the statutory PSHE curriculum (Personal, Social, Health and Economic education).



Year 7

It gives students real-life examples in terms of policing issues within the community, drugs and alcohol, the LGBTQ+ community, gambling and charitable trusts."

42 Year 7 Geographers chosen by their geography teachers due to their excellent attitude to learning in lessons completed a day of fieldwork investigating the contrasting geography of our local area.


