### Ormiston Venture Academy is celebrating after achieving 'Outstanding' in our Section 8 Ofsted Inspection.

Ofsted inspectors observed the Academy's work, scrutinised documents and met with the Principal, senior and middle leaders, groups of students and representatives of the Governing Board to examine every aspect of Venture Academy life.

The Academy was awarded a glowing report praising the day to day running of the school, the quality of learning and teaching, student achievement and the capacity to improve even further.

**The report stated: "Standards have risen sharply since opening. Changes introduced by senior leaders have generated a strong ethos based on regular attendance, hard effort and high achievement. Senior leaders have raised students' expectations and engendered a corporate willingness of staff to provide every student with the skills and qualifications for the next stage of their education, training or the work-place. A combination of improved teaching and behaviour, extensive monitoring and targeted interventions to support students at risk of underachieving has led to a rapid rise in standards."**

The report further stated that students believed that "they are on-track to achieve what they are capable of because of the high expectations teachers have of

them and the help and encouragement they provided. Lessons observed jointly by senior leaders and inspectors confirmed this. Classrooms were orderly, calm and purposeful. Lesson planning was thorough with clear objectives. Teachers used a range of techniques to capture students' interest, encourage them to contribute their ideas and learn together in small groups."



The report concluded that pupils make outstanding progress in their studies. They greatly enjoy coming to school and attendance is high. Pupils behave well and they respond enthusiastically to the growing team of dedicated staff. "Inspirational, highly effective leadership from the Principal has driven a wide range of improvements in a short period of time. Aably supported by senior and middle leaders, she has reignited students' belief that they are capable of achieving success. She has won the confidence and respect of students and gained the full commitment of staff to deliver the Academy's aims.

Principal McCartney said: "We are delighted that Ofsted has endorsed our work in creating an innovative, creative and achievement-driven Academy; a place where pupils come to learn and develop. I'm particularly pleased that they have highlighted the hard work of our staff and the good behaviour and work of our pupils."




# Venture into Business...

# NEW BUILD

In the short period since it started, our Academy has achieved a step-change in student achievement, and has successfully raised aspirations within the Academy community.



All this has been achieved within the existing building that is sometimes problematic. There is now a chance to capitalise on the hard work already done with the remodelling of the existing building. Balfour Beatty Construction Limited and Ormiston Venture Academy have submitted a planning application for the redevelopment of the Academy building. The proposal is a scheme that links seamlessly existing, remodelled and new build accommodation, to provide a great learning environment where the Academy's principles of achieving best performance for students and staff can be realised. Our intention is to provide a new and refurbished building that will match the educational improvements already achieved by the Academy's students. The scheme presents significant opportunities and benefits including:

- A clear and welcoming student and visitor access to the new Academy
- Improved facilities and sports facilities for both students and the community
- A new tiered lecture theatre seating 90
- New parking on site adjacent to the existing sports hall

Views of the new building from Oriol Avenue give a clear sense of entrance, kerb appeal and increase the Academy's status in the community. The new building encloses a south-facing square, landscaped and open, with hard and soft informal play spaces, low walled external dining area and an amphitheatre.

## Karate Champion - Mark Burgess

Mark Burgess is a keen student here at Ormiston Venture Academy who participates in karate at a club in the community. Mark achieved his black belt in January this year, and has won a number of national competitions.

Riding his motorbike at speeds of up to 140 miles per hour, Charlie was not only placed second in the under-25 event but finished an incredible third overall in a competition featuring 40 riders. Charlie's finishing position was due to consistently high finishes in his four races.

Racing across the country at tracks such as Brands Hatch, Donington and Norfolk's very own Snetterton, Charlie's races are part of the British Motor Cycle Racing Club which can lead to the European Championships.

Charlie's biggest hurdle in the sport, which he says gives him an 'adrenaline-rush of energy', is that of funding. With just the cost of tyres totalling around £500 for each weekend of racing, Charlie's sport costs about £12,000 a year.



In order to compete at a national level, Charlie continues to look for sponsors and is hoping that he can turn some heads during a feature race at Donington during the World Superbike Championships next month.

## Joy for Jessica-Jane In the GB Olympic Pool

March 3rd – 10th 2012 saw local youngster Jess Applegate compete at the Olympic & Paralympic selection trials held at the London Aquatic Centre.

Anyone wishing to compete at either event had to race at the selection trials to have a chance of selection. It was not just a massive achievement to qualify to attend this event but Jess also achieved a personal best time. She was accompanied by her head coach Alex Pinniger, to make sure everything ran smoothly!

15 year old Jess, from Gorleston, was swimming in the S14 disability category. Jess stormed the pool on Saturday morning finishing with a personal best and a place in the evening's finals. The pressure was really on. It was the first round of trials for Paralympic swimmers, she was competing in an unfamiliar pool and it was live on BBC1's red button! Jess did not disappoint and anyone at home viewing can verify how electric the atmosphere was. Jess finished not only in first place within the Paralympic qualifying time but now holds a new British record for her time. Jess said 'I swam so hard I couldn't feel my legs afterwards, they felt like they had turned to jelly'.

To qualify for the Paralympics there are two rounds of trials, further classification assessments and then a selection process. The final team should be confirmed by May.

Sunday saw Jess compete in the 100m backstroke where she also had a strong race and touched just outside her personal best time, unfortunately not making finals in this event.

Jess swims with Alex Pinniger under the UEA city of Norwich. Alex said "We had seven swimmers qualify and attend the British Gas Championships which is a fantastic achievement. We also had 157 other parents and swimmers come to London to show their support. Of course it's all about the swimming but the club offers a fabulous support network for every swimmer. Now it's back to training for everyone preparing for the forthcoming events".

Thank you to all of the staff at the Phoenix pool in Bradwell for helping Jess out with some training sessions when she had some difficulties.
