From September 2024, our approach to teacher education is evolving as we enter into a new partnership with the National Institute of Teaching.

Ormiston Teacher Training – our School-Centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT) – will deliver high-quality teacher education across four regional campuses situated in the West Midlands, Staffordshire, Norfolk and Suffolk.

We have a commitment to high quality, evidenceinformed teacher education and we are on a mission to improve the quality of teacher development across the system.

Why train with us?

Our vision is to transform the lives of pupils by nurturing the talents of teachers.

Our initial teacher training (ITT) programme, in partnership with the National Institute of Teaching (NIoT), is a fully immersive school-centred programme – aspiring teachers will be in the classroom from the very start. They are fully supported, and each have a dedicated mentor and core training sessions once a week with the Ormiston Teacher Training team.

As an Associate College of the NIoT, we are in the privileged position of being able to offer our aspiring teachers a programme that is rooted in national research whilst reflecting the local contexts of the schools and communities in which they will work. The Norfolk campus will be based at Ormiston Venture Academy and plays a key role in the development of both new and experienced staff with over a decade of experience in leading training across East Anglia. Through successful delivery of initial teacher training, NQT/ECT programmes, teacher development programmes and leadership qualifications we are proud of the number of educational practitioners we have supported throughout this time.

This year, our Union of Venture Students (UVS) has participated in our very first Active Travel Ambassador (ATA) program.

This consists of 5 sessions in our training room, a presentation and the all-important campaign to make change. Part of this was an opportunity to present to a panel of experts at a 'Campaign Junction Event'; pitching ideas for more environmentally friendly travel to and from our academy. This took place at the Norman Centre in Norwich and Venture was one of three local schools bidding for funding to put our ideas into action.

The travel experts listened to all three pitches, before deciding on funding of up to £200 for each school, with an extra £50 awarded to the academy with the best ideas. This event was to share ideas, increase the profile of the ATA program and for schools and Local Authorities to meet and network. The Active Travel Ambassador program's vision is for a society in which active and sustainable travel is the preferred mode of transportation, creating healthier spaces, healthier people and healthier communities. By committing to the program, the ATAs at Venture hope to establish genuine change, whist having fun.

OF EDINBURGH'S AWARD

In an inspiring demonstration of resilience and teamwork, students from Ormiston Venture Academy recently collaborated with City of Norwich School (CNS) on a challenging Duke of Edinburgh (DofE) Bronze Award qualifying expedition.

This event marked a significant milestone, particularly for Ormiston Venture Academy, as their students successfully completed the expedition despite facing severe weather conditions.

The expedition, held in the picturesque countryside of Baconsthorpe, North Norfolk, closely mirrored the practice training expedition. However, this time, the five-student team from Ormiston Venture Academy felt more confident and independent, ready to apply the skills they had honed during their practice runs. Their expedition assessor, Miss Lowe, supervised them remotely from the campsite using GPS trackers equipped with an SOS feature for safety. She met the group twice each day to ensure their well-being and progress.

Armed with maps and compasses, the students adeptly navigated their designated route. Friday's journey was marked by persistent rain, while Saturday presented the additional challenge of a thunderstorm. Despite the harsh conditions, the team was well-prepared with waterproof gear, demonstrating their readiness and commitment. Notably, this was the first time students from Ormiston Venture Academy had completed their Bronze Award amidst such extreme weather, adding to the sense of achievement.

A unique aspect of their expedition was the team's goal to monitor and record their moods throughout the journey. Using a digital camera provided by Ms. Tye from the photography department, the students documented their feelings on a scale of one to ten by holding up fingers. This creative approach provided fascinating



insights into their emotional journey, revealing a dynamic range of moods yet underscored by unwavering resilience and determination.

The physical exertion of the expedition was notable, with the students clocking in a total of 35,637 steps on Friday and 28,284 steps on Saturday. These figures are a testament to their endurance and physical capability.

Miss Lowe, the DofE Manager, expressed her immense pride in the students, stating, "I am always proud of every student that participates in their DofE journey, and I could not think of anything more rewarding than to support these students in achieving the Bronze DofE Award. The students that have successfully completed the expedition should be so proud of themselves as they faced uncontrollable weather conditions of all four seasons and showed nothing but determination and resilience throughout!"

Echoing her sentiments, Mr. Webb, **DofE** Assistant Manager, praised the students for their exceptional teamwork and resilience.

Friday Talks at Venture

In 2023-24 we have continued our series of 'Friday Talks' at Venture.

Via our Union of Venture Students, students are given the opportunity to request a talk or a presentation they would like. These usually fit into one of three categories;

- A career they might be interested in
- A hobby they have a passion for
- An area of general interest

In the summer term, we have heard from a Fire Fighter, a volunteer from the RNLI, a paralegal, Norfolk Pride and a former student who offered talk about new T-Levels at college.



We have had anywhere between 15 and 73 students show up for these Q & A sessions, with an average of around 20 students each week.

Director of Personal Development Spencer Doggett commented,

"We have had several successful talks again this term. We advertise them all week and students often ask me what the talk is going to be on any given Friday. We already have a prison officer, a mental health nurse and an expert in atomic energy booked in from September."





As part of the Combined Cadet Force (CCF), Year 8 and 9 students from Venture attended a training session at the local Fritton Woods.

They participated in bivouac (shelter) building, hiking, map reading, compass reading, fieldwork and developed key employability skills such as communication, showing initiative and teamwork.



Ormiston Venture Academy took part in Victory in Europe (VE) Day commemorations on May 8th at St. George's Park, Great Yarmouth.

Invited by the Royal British Legion (RBL), 6 members of the UVS represented the academy and laid a wreath as a mark of respect.

Who shot JFKR

Year 9 students collected a range of forensic and historical evidence to unpick the events of November 22nd, 1963, when John F Kennedy was assassinated while riding in a presidential motorcade through Dealey Plaza in Dallas, Texas.

They explored ballistics, physical evidence, gunshot residue, photographic analysis, fingerprints and autopsy reports.

They looked at the timings of the crucial events of day and investigated the possible motivations of some of the main groups that have been suspected of links to the crime. They used analytical and critical thinking skills to question parts of the Warren Commission Report and try to reach their own conclusions.

Students really enjoyed the day and came up with some interesting ideas for who they thought might be responsible.



Africa Alive

Year 8 STEMM Club students planned a day trip to Africa Alive for a group of year 7 students to look at the classification of different groups of endangered species and the contribution of zoos to their conservation and protection. As a part of their STEMM Award portfolio they produced a variety of short written tasks and supported small groups of students as they made their way around the zoo investigating the different animals.

At lunch time the whole group were treated to a short lecture on conservation from 'Professor' Jaime.

They listened with incredibly close attention as Jaime described the role of Africa Alive in the conservation of endangered species and explained some of the things that they could do as individuals to conserve their own environment and how that could contribute to the preservation of biodiversity on the planet.



Our vision at Venture is to provide World Class education to all and provide opportunities for our students to be subject specialists in all their subjects. Students study a broad curriculum that prepares pupils to be experts in all areas of study. In English, students have the opportunity to study Shakespeare, analyse poetry, write creatively and all students are also exposed to both modern and pre 1900s texts.

Achieve

Trips to the theatre (to see the Woman in Black this year) and the Globe Theatre are popular annual events. The English team also leads the way with our annual World Book Day celebrations and runs key events such as the 'poetry slam' when all colleges compete against each other and the annual spellathon, run by students for local primary school students.

Our Modern Foreign Languages incorporate French and Spanish; both very popular choices for our linguists at GCSE level. Key topics include the theme of identity and culture, school, the local area, future plans and the international global dimension. Beyond the classroom, MFL offers inter-school debating competitions and you may spot students proudly adorning 'master linguist' badges, attained in either subject for excellence in examinations or extended learning. Trips to Disneyland Paris, Belgium and Madrid have been arranged enhance the reputation of this area of the academy.

Within the Humanities faculty, History students are taught about the development of Britain following the Battle of Hastings through to colonialism under the reign of Queen Victoria, while international topics are explored such as the American Revolution and apartheid in South Africa. In Geography, students learn about the eco-system and the impact climate change has on rivers and flooding as well as other hazards and the causes and consequences of population growth all over the planet. Local fieldwork on our coast, as well as trips to Poland and the First World War trenches are always well received. Finally, Religious Education has been a popular addition to the Humanities Faculty.

Students learn about Christian practices, Hinduism, Judaism and Islam. Year 9 study a unit on morality and Year 10 learn about ethics. This is taught as part of a well-rounded Humanities offerCASH curriculum, but from 2023-24, RE will be taught as part of a well-rounded Humanities offer in Year 7-9.

We run these trips every year to widen the students experiences, not just within Computer Science but also their own Cultural Capital.

The introduction of our new iMedia GCSE has meant that our students can develop their creative skills by planning, designing and creating media products such as websites, games apps and marketing materials. This is a highly popular course to encourage the link with Art, Graphic Design and Games design.

The Create subjects include Art, Catering, Music, Performing Arts, Photography and Textiles. Best practice and expertise is shared on a daily basis, within the faculty, but also outside of the Academy through Ormiston Academy Trust links and competitions.

The Create College is the one of the most enjoyable places to be for staff and students. It operates a broad and balanced curriculum for students in Key Stage 3, with students studying visual arts, performance and technology based subjects in more depth.

Key Stage 4 offers GCSE and BTEC qualifications and is hugely popular. An incredible amount of students go on to study at least 1 Create subject from year 10, and many leave with aspirations of further study in this area after achieving some exceptionally high results.



Students go on to study these subjects in more depth in Colleges and Sixth Forms. Apprenticeships in engineering and scholarships at Gresham's are also available. We have had success with Callum then going on to study Fine Art at Oxford University and Daisy dancing in Colchester College for example.

The extra-curricular opportunities within the Create College feature highly in the Academey's provision. Clubs and activities such as Musical or talent show rehearsals, choir and orchestra (Venture Vivace), photography skills and street dance amongst others, complement sessions based on improving qualification grades. Peri lessons enhance musical talent, and we are very grateful for the team of staff who come into the Academy for this.

Creative guilds such as film special FX make up, dress making, crochet, pom pom making, band skills, photography and textiles experimentation also contribute to the programme, and are often massively oversubscribed!!

Showcase events such as the bi-annual musical sell out audiences and the Create show is a representation of the fine work produced by students in Create. The show includes incredible Art and Photography exhibitions, phenomenal Craft and Textiles products, spine tingling musical entertainment, singing and performances.



The College is prominent in the local community attending carol services, lantern parades and performing at the Hippodrome concert. The Performing Arts students also performed in the recent Ormiston Academies Trust annual talent showcase.

Guest artists, graphical designers, animators, photographers, chefs, singers and dancers have graced our College and many trips to exhibitions and the West End theatre companies have occurred, broadening horizons and showing students the fruits of what can be achieved in this area.

Mrs Vincent, College Leader commented on "how amazing the young people are in the best college in the Academy, and lots of that was down to the talented and devoted staff we have".

Students in Science have had a fantastic opportunity to complete practical experiments and engage in the awe and wonder that is science knowledge.

Practical skills are so important, they create the love of learning that our students so often talk about. For example in Year 7 they were investigating how shape effects streamlining using wallpaper paste and plasticine models and year 8 have been investigating acids and alkalis. In year 9,10 and 11 students have been completing rotations of science subjects benefiting from subject specialist teaching, enhancing every opportunity in the science curriculum.

The Science Faculty has invested in a 3D printer and are now redesigning and 3D-printing equipment that allows students to work more safely and more efficiently in lessons. The picture shows a redesigned test tube rack that is more stable and allows observations to be made more easily, a bespoke stand for electrolysis equipment that reduces the risk of it tipping over in the middle of an investigation, a beaker lid that holds a thermometer upright in the centre of the beaker and a mini quadrat so that ecological sampling can take place whatever the weather. Many other improvements to commercially available equipment are in the design phase and a College Clash competition and

enrichment clubs to design improved science equipment are offered on a weekly basis. **NNOVALE**

The students at Ormiston Venture academy complete six sports across each year with fitness built in throughout each sport.

The students complete these sports as it is a progression from primary school building on prior knowledge, it also links into the academy fixture cycle in the local area to give all students the opportunity to excel beyond the classroom creating links with local sports clubs.

In years 7 & 8 and 9, students focus on learning the fundamental key skills and knowledge in a variety of team and individual sports referenced in the national curriculum. In Year 10 & 11 students opt into three bespoke sport pathways. These are OCR Cambridge National Sport Studies qualification, Leadership award achieving the UK Sport Leaders Level 1 and Level 2 award, and Health and Fitness, achieving a gym instructors qualification on completion of the course.



The students complete the OCR Cambridge Nationals Sport Studies qualification because it develops their understanding of a range of sports which can lead to increased participation rates, enjoyment and wellbeing whilst with us and post 16.

Within this the students complete a compulsory exam unit, leadership unit which permeates through the curriculum from year 7. Leadership in sport is linked to our curriculum intent promoting the skills and qualities the students will need to become all rounded good citizens. As this is a priority to us at Venture focusing on ambition and the qualities students will need some students will be completing a sports leadership qualification route. Health and Fitness will be taught to raise students knowledge on how to eat healthily and how to train to improve their fitness for a variety of sports.

Orienteering was chosen for all students because it shows the diverse career pathways available to students, and continues to develop health and fitness in sports that would appeal and include all students. Practical sport is to nurture student talent for the venture elite programme, encouraging sporting participation post 16.

We have a wide variety of extra curricular clubs and teams for boys and girls such as football, rugby, netball and many more. We recently came second in the Wellesley Athletics tournament that all six local schools were involved in.
