All our teacher training courses lead to QTS (Qualified Teacher Status), a PGCE (Postgraduate Certificate in Education) and 60 master's level credits.

Enrichment week
The Bug Parc visit



Our Year 7 and 8 students recently took part in an exciting and educational visit to The Bug Parc in Lenwade—our first ever trip to this unique venue.

The experience was designed to complement the "Nature's Life Cycle" themed project currently being explored by Year 8 in Textile Design, a project Year 7 students will undertake next academic year.

This creative project draws inspiration from the natural world, with a particular focus on insects. Students study the work of visionary designers and artists such as Alexander McQueen, Damien Hirst, and interior design icons Matthew Williamson and Timorous Beasties—all

of whom have found beauty and meaning in the intricate details of nature and the insect kingdom.

The visit provided a hands-on and immersive way to explore the subject matter. Students encountered a wide variety of insect species and attended several fascinating talks. One highlight was a session about leaf-cutter ants, where students learned how the colony operates with astonishing cooperation and complexity.

In the Kirby Tropical House, students discovered how some insects, like scorpions, glow under UV light. Many were brave enough to hold an Amblypygid—a spider-like creature known for its long, delicate legs that can span up to 27 inches! In Hinton House, students came face-to-face with grasshoppers, katydids, crickets, praying mantises, cockroaches, assassin bugs, leeches, giant water bugs, snails, and crabs. A few daring students even ventured into the Spider Section, showing great courage and curiosity.

One of the most popular areas was the New Butterfly House, where students stepped into a tropical haven kept at a warm 25–30°C year-round. Surrounded by vibrant plants and over 400 butterflies from

more than 30 species, the experience was magical. One student even became a butterfly favourite thanks to a particularly colourful hat!

The day also included an insect handling experience, giving both students and staff the opportunity to hold harmless creatures such as stick insects, millipedes, and cockroaches—an unforgettable chance to get up close and personal with nature.

After a morning of discovery, students had time to unwind and enjoy themselves. Laughter and fun filled the air as they raced around the go-kart track and bounced with energy on the giant inflatable pillow during their lunch break.

This trip not only deepened students' understanding of the natural world but also inspired creative thinking and bravery. We're incredibly proud of how engaged and enthusiastic our students were throughout the day, and we're excited to see how this experience influences their future work in Textile Design.



### Enrichment week - Beach visit



As part of Enrichment Week, the vast majority of Year 7 students enjoyed a fantastic day of sports at Gorleston Beach. The walk down to the beach served as a warm-up, with students demonstrating excellent behaviour throughout.



From the very first environmental audit to designing a powerful year-long action plan, their journey has been nothing short of inspiring.

"We meet every Friday afternoon," shared Mr. Doggett. "Jo Robson has been instrumental in supporting the team, and together we've achieved so much this year—running school-wide assemblies, launching a 'Cut Your Carbon' campaign, picking litter, planting 210 trees, and reintroducing the popular 'Walking and Wheeling Wednesday' this May. And the cherry on top? We secured £10,000 in funding for a brand-new Eco Garden—and it's already taking shape!"

### The Geography department recently led an exciting and enriching fieldwork trip for 80 Year 10 students, as part of their GCSE Geography studies.

Over the course of two days, students had the opportunity to apply their classroom learning in a real-world context by investigating the urban and coastal environments in and around Gorleston-on-Sea.

The fieldwork was split into two key areas of study: urban geography and coastal management. In Gorleston's urban centre, students worked collaboratively to complete Environmental Quality Surveys. These surveys allowed them to assess the changing nature of the town's built environment, providing valuable insights into urban planning, regeneration, and quality of life.

On the coast, students focused their investigations on the effectiveness of coastal management strategies. They visited both Gorleston and nearby Hopton beaches, measuring beach width and recording visible signs of erosion. This hands-on work helped students evaluate the impact of human intervention on coastal processes, reinforcing key curriculum concepts in a practical setting.

Matthew Sutton, Head of Geography, praised the students for their approach to the fieldwork. "I was impressed with the maturity shown by the students across both days of fieldwork and the quality of work students have produced," he said.

The trip not only deepened students' understanding of geographical theory but also gave them a valuable experience in teamwork, data collection, and critical analysis. The Geography department looks forward to supporting students as they now apply their findings in the classroom and prepare for their GCSE assessments.

Thank you to all of the local companies for their support for the Venture Stars 2025 event.













A Hub of Academic Excellence

### At Venture Academy, Achieve College is easily recognised by the bright blue badges proudly worn by its students.

Led by Assistant Principal Mr. Doggett and College Leader Mr. Ives, Achieve College focuses on three key subject areas: English, Humanities (History, Geography, and Religious Education), and Modern Foreign Languages. Each area is supported by a dedicated tutor group, fostering a strong sense of identity and subject pride.

We are committed to delivering a world-class education, where every student is encouraged to become a confident, knowledgeable subject specialist. Our broad and ambitious curriculum is designed to inspire curiosity, deepen understanding, and prepare students for success in all areas of study.

English offers students the chance to explore a wide range of texts, from Shakespeare and pre-1900 literature to modern novels and poetry. Lessons encourage creative writing and critical thinking. Outside the classroom, students take part in theatre trips—such as a recent Year 7 visit to see Macbeth and attend events at the Globe Theatre. The English team also leads school-wide celebrations for World Book Day and exciting inter-college competitions like the Poetry Slam and Spellathon, which even involves local primary schools.

In Modern Foreign Languages, students choose between French and Spanish, both popular options at GCSE. Lessons cover topics such as identity, culture, school life, future plans, and global issues. Students are encouraged to take part in debating competitions and may earn a 'Master Linguist' badge for outstanding effort and achievement. Educational trips to Disneyland Paris, Belgium, and Madrid help bring language learning to life. We were sad to say goodbye to Ms. Webb, who has taken on an exciting role teaching in Japan, but are thrilled to welcome Ms. Mills, who has already made a fantastic impact.

Humanities subjects offer rich learning experiences. In History, students explore key periods such as the Norman Conquest, the Victorian Empire, the American Revolution, and apartheid in South Africa. In Geography, they study environmental systems, climate change, natural hazards, and global population trends. Fieldwork is an essential part of learning, with local trips to the coast and international visits to places like Poland and WWI battlefields.

Religious Education is taught as part of the Humanities curriculum in Years 7 to 9, covering major world religions and ethical issues. In Year 9, students study morality, while Year 10 students explore topics in ethics.

### Mathematics: Thinking Beyond Numbers

Maths at Venture is more than just equations—it's about exploring patterns, solving problems, and thinking critically. Our carefully developed curriculum supports and challenges students at every level, helping them grow into confident and capable mathematicians.

Maths is a vital part of everyday life, with real-world applications that range from weather forecasting to architecture, engineering, and finance. At Ormiston Venture, we aim to develop subject specialists, and many of our students go on to study maths at a higher level after Year 11. For those who enjoy stretching themselves even further, we offer GCSE Further Maths and GCSE Statistics—both popular choices with high-performing students.

We also invite guest speakers into school to show how maths is used in various careers, and our external trips allow students to see mathematical applications in action—bringing the subject to life in exciting and practical ways.

Looking ahead, our maths team is already planning more enriching and inspiring opportunities for the next academic year.

Computer Science: Innovation, Creativity and Real-World Skills

It's also been a standout year for Computer Science. Our students have covered a broad and engaging curriculum including E-Safety, Programming, Digital Media, Cyber Security, Hardware and Software, Networking, and Data Representation. Lessons combine theory with handson experiences to create an interactive, relevant, and enjoyable learning environment.

This year, we were proud to offer three major trips in Computer Science, with almost 200 students taking part. Visits to The Cambridge Centre for Computing History, Silverstone and Bletchley Park were all hugely successful. At Cambridge, students explored the evolution of technology and took a close look at the "Influential Women in Computing History" exhibit. At Silverstone, pupils had an insight into the highly advanced computer systems in F1 alongside the rich history of racing. At Bletchley Park, students gained valuable insights into code-breaking and how it relates to today's data protection and cyber security practices.



These visits not only enrich classroom learning, but also help develop students' cultural capital, expanding their understanding of how computing shapes the world around them.

We were also thrilled to introduce our new iMedia GCSE this year. This creative and technical course allows students to design and produce digital products such as websites, game apps, and marketing materials. It's an exciting addition that bridges creativity and computing, linking closely with subjects like Art, Graphic Design, and Game Design. Unsurprisingly, it has proven to be a very popular choice among students.

It's been another exciting and successful year for Innovate College, where students have embraced hands-on learning, built new skills, and experienced a wide range of opportunities in Science and Physical **Education (PE).** 

Our dedicated team of staff continues to inspire a love of learning and personal development through a rich, engaging curriculum.

### Science: Curiosity in Action

This year, Science students have enjoyed getting hands-on with practical experiments designed to spark curiosity and deepen understanding. From investigating streamlining with plasticine and wallpaper paste in Year 7, to exploring acids and alkalis in Year 8, and rotating through specialisms in Years 9-11, students are benefiting from high-quality, specialist-led teaching every step of the way.

A particular highlight has been our investment in cutting-edge 3D printing technology. The faculty is now producing custom-designed science equipment, enhancing safety and learning in the classroom. These include redesigned test tube racks, electrolysis stands, and mini quadrats—all helping students explore science more effectively.

Our weekly enrichment clubs and 'College Clash' competitions give students the chance to design their own scientific tools—promoting innovation, collaboration and creative thinking.

### Physical Education: Health, Fitness, and Leadership

Physical Education at Venture is about far more than fitness—it's about nurturing a lifelong love for sport, teamwork, and leadership. Throughout the year, students from Years 7–9 have participated in a wide variety of team and individual sports, developing their skills, confidence, and resilience. These activities are carefully selected to build on primary school learning and connect to the wider community, with many students continuing their journey by joining local sports clubs.

### In Years 10 and 11, students can choose from three tailored PE pathways:

- OCR Cambridge National Sport Studies

- Health and Fitness, leading to a gym instructor qualification
